Recently the Centene Corporation celebrated the grand opening of its new \$25-million Ferguson Service Center, creating 250+ jobs. The Clayco/Centene project consists of three buildings on the 8-acre site. The first is a 45,000 sf, 3-level tilt up operations center, the second is a 1-level, 6,000 sf day care and the third is a 1-level, 6,000 sf training facility. Clayco's subcontractors did a great job helping with their Diversity/Inclusion efforts. The project construction included 27 Minority & Women Owned firms, which equated to 40% of the construction value. Additionally, the workforce was made up of 33% minorities, from Clayco and the various trades. Clayco's on-site secretary was hired from the community and has since been brought on as a full time employee of Clayco. This project has become a true asset for the Ferguson Community.
